

Traditional vs Print Denture Flow Chart

Pick up in the morning counts as first day in lab; pick up in afternoon counts as next day in lab

TRADITIONAL DENTURE

First Appointment:

* Take preliminary impressions to fabricate custom trays (three days in lab)

Second Appointment:

* Take master impression to fabricate baseplate and wax rim (two days in lab)

Third Appointment:

* Try in baseplate and wax rim and take bite registration. Return for setup (three days in lab)

Fourth Appointment:

* Try-in/Tooth try in and return for process (two days in lab)

Fifth Appointment:

* Insert full denture.

PRINT DENTURE

First Appointment:

* Take preliminary impressions to fabricate baseplate and wax rim (two days in lab)

Second Appointment:

* Take bite registation using baseplate and wax rim and then take reline wash final impression inside the baseplate, using it as your custom tray (three days in lab)

Third Appointment:

* Try-in and return with any adjustment notes for printing (two days in lab)

Fourth Appointment:

* Insert full denture.
